

## FASHION REVUE - UPCYCLED FASHION CONTEST

<b>Contest Description:</b>	4-H U Fashion Revue is a part of an educational program sponsored by the LSU AgCenter. It consists of three different contest categories. In the Fashion Revue Program, 4-H members are evaluated based on consumer decision making, quality analysis, quality of construction or workmanship, degree of difficulty, modeling, fit and appearance. <b>The Upcycled Fashion Contest</b> demonstrates recycling knowledge and redesign skills using recyclable materials to create a wearable outfit for the runway. The design should be wearable, neat and of quality workmanship. Clothing should meet acceptable standards of appropriateness for a 4-H or school function. Most clothing can be upcycled which means to reuse a discarded item to create a product of better quality than the original or into something new and usable.

### Contest Rules:

1. Refer to Louisiana 4-H University General Rules and Guidelines for a complete set of event rules and guidelines.
2. Contestant may not enter a garment that was entered in any previous State 4-H U Fashion Revue Contest. A garment entered at local, parish, and regional events may be entered in State Contest.
3. All entries must be a complete outfit. May be any number of pieces but may not contain more pieces than can be worn at one time.
4. Garments are not submitted for judging, only the data packet.
5. Data packet must be submitted online by June 10, 2022. Online submission information will be located under contest rules at [www.lsuagcenter.com/4hu](http://www.lsuagcenter.com/4hu)
6. Contestants must create a new outfit, not simply embellish an old one that is wearable.
7. Garments must be made of at least 75% recycled or reused materials that would be thrown into landfills. The focus is to take recyclable materials headed for the landfill and turn them into fashion. Do not purchase or use new items. Do not use glass or glitter.
8. Materials used in the construction of garments MUST be post-consumer, post-industrial or post agricultural waste. Designers may use materials for construction such as glue, tape, dyes, markers, thread, zippers, elastic, wire, string, Velcro, boning, buckram, grommets, laces, starch, paint etc. No food wastes. Footwear made from recyclable material is preferred, however, street shoes are acceptable. Shoes must be safe to walk in.
9. Accessories may be made of recyclable materials as well but not required.
10. Details for Fashion Revue Week, competition numbers and Fashion Show line up numbers will be found in the 4-H Agent's Parish registration packet.
11. During 4-H University, Wednesday morning contest, contestants will model 4-H U outfit for appearance judging at designated location.
12. Contestants will participate in Fashion Show Rehearsal held at designated location on Wednesday afternoon.
13. Contestants will model outfit for the 4-H U Fashion Show held Thursday afternoon in LSU Union Theater.
